

Why Digital Art?

Farnoosh Doroodgar emphasizes the importance of recognizing digital painting as equally valuable as other forms of artistic expression. Below is a summary of her curational proposal aimed at **redefining art in the digital age**, 2025:

To answer the question of whether digital art is real art, one must first provide a clear and concise definition of the concept of art. The word art is adopted from the Greek word 'ars' (craft) which in ancient Latin signified: the ability to produce a preconceived result through consciously controlled and directed action. Unlike art, in craftsmanship, there is always requires a distinction between **means and ends**, each clearly understood as something separate but related to the other. The term "means" is loosely applied to things used to achieve the end, such as tools, machines, or fuel. We perform these actions, as the literal meaning of the word means suggests, and we go through them to reach the goal, and when we reach the goal, we put them aside (R.G. Collingwood,1938). Nevertheless, it is important to distinguish that art is not merely a craft. The overlooked Latin connotation has obscured the fundamental nature of what contemporary society recognizes as **real art**, leading to a misinterpretation of emerging digital art forms.


A craftsman knows what he wants to make before he makes it but artist doesn't. This foreknowledge is absolutely essential to the craft. A craftsman possesses a clear understanding of the purpose behind the creation of their artifact. In contrast, an artist is not constrained by a specific default, tool, or technique of artistic expression. Consequently, a purely technical approach or tool for analyzing a technique is only applicable to the evaluation of craft, not art.

This distinction highlights that, due to modern tools, we often perceive digital art as merely digital craft, thereby undermining the creativity and artistic value of the artist's work.














